

WHAT MIGHT HAPPEN AS A RESULT OF TEST AND TRACE

Individual tests positive

- The Individual must follow the advice of NHS Test & Trace.
- This may include providing details of where they have been 48 hours before they developed symptoms or tested positive.
- If netball activity is involved in the list they provide to NHS test and trace, they may be required to provide contact details of the COVID-19 Officer.
- The individual should also notify the COVID-19 Officer of the positive test result so that they can prepare for a call from NHS Test & Trace.
- The risk mitigations and rule modifications have been designed so that netball activity should not fall within the NHS definition of close contact.
- The COVID-19 Officer should reflect how closely risk mitigations and rule modifications were followed at the session the individual attended.

COVID-19 Officer may be contacted for details

- NHS Test & Trace may want to make contact with the COVID-19 Officer.
- The COVID-19 Officer may then need to provide the contact details of any other members that were at the session and could have been in contact with the positive case.
- If competition, the COVID-19 Officer should also provide details to NHS of the oppositions COVID-19 Officer.
- The COVID-19 Officer, should notify the opposition COVID-19 Officer as well as the league COVID-19 Officer.
- If NHS Test & Trace do not contact the COVID-19 Officer and risk mitigations and rule modifications were followed at the session no further action is required by the COVID-19 officer.
- The COVID-19 Officer should not make decisions as to who should be self isolating. This is the role of the NHS

Notification

- If there are **more than 2 positive cases** of COVID-19 in any modified netball activity with in a 14 day period; the COVID-19 Officer should notify England Netball on Covid@Englandnetball.co.uk
